How to apply

- Eligible to apply online from second year of Foundation training via the National Recruitment Office
- Twice yearly recruitment for programmes to commence in August and February each year; Knowledge and Situational Judgement exams, if successful invited to Selection Centre (one written exam and 3 simulated scenarios)
- Highly scoring applicants from the written exam will move directly to the 'offer', thereby bypassing Selection Centre
- Able to specify more detailed geographical preferences at Round 1
- Deferred entry now possible for up to 12 months

Training Scheme

- 3 year training programme, normally:
 - 18 months in general practice (12 and 4 months placements)
 - 18 months in hospital with a mix of 4 and 6 month placements
- Weekly half day release teaching program plus private study
- MRCGP exam
 - Applied Knowledge Test and Clinical Skills Assessment
